2 Wednesday 7th May, 2pm Living at Altitude: History and Health in Peru - Talk by Dr Carole Reeves

Dr Carole Reeves returns to Allendale House with another of her amazing talks about human health. The Peruvian Andes have been inhabited by humans for about 12,000 years providing time for adaptation to living at high altitude. When the Spanish colonists arrived in the 16th century they initially fared quite badly in terms of health, fertility and childhood mortality. Today, about a quarter of Peru's population lives at altitudes higher than 2500 metres but even the most adapted populations have developed health problems not imagined or understood in the past.

Join us on a visit to the home of Dr Edward Jenner (1749-1823), the pioneering scientist whose discoveries still greatly impact our lives today. Learn about the great man from the place where he devised the very first vaccinations and enjoy the peaceful gardens which still grow the herbs that the Dr himself would have used. Refreshments are provided at Dr Jenner's, but you will need to find lunch yourself from various options available in the town or bring a packed lunch. After lunch enjoy a guided tour of the magnificent Berkeley Castle, which was built in 1153 to keep the Welsh out. A truly extraordinary castle that, for over nine centuries, has endured in its entirety with the same family - a rare and remarkable feat. Its historical significance lies not only in its preservation but also in the pivotal role the Berkeley family and their ancestral home have played in shaping the power struggles and events of countless centuries – it has an unrivalled history to share.

Thursday 22nd May, 10am Chettle and Farnham Walk - Approximately 7 miles

Join us on this walk and enjoy some lovely views of Cranborne Chase and perhaps some of the local wildlife. No steep hills or stiles, but undulating terrain.

During the First World War, an estimated 60,000 volunteers served with the British Red Cross Society throughout Britain, providing support in caring for sick and wounded servicemen returning from the Front. Wednesday 4th June, 2pm Rolls (of Rolls-Royce) and Britain's First International Aviation Meeting -Talk by Stephen Robson

The Honourable Charles Rolls came from a wealthy background and instead of living the life of a gentleman, he chose to pursue speed whether in cycling, cars, balloons or aeroplanes. As well as his well-known interests in the car industry he was also an aviation enthusiast and pioneer. In 1910, having completed the first non-stop return flight across the English Channel, Rolls died in the UK's first fatal powered aircraft crash while performing a display at Britain's First International Aviation meeting which was held at Southbourne, Bournemouth.

We are delighted to welcome back popular Orkney based singer-songwriter Jo Philby and Shaftesbury singer and musician Anne-Louise Richards.



Chawton House, near Alton in Hampshire, was known to Jane Austen as the 'Great House', as it was owned by her brother Edward. Jane lived in a cottage on his estate and would stroll up to spend many an hour in the grand Elizabethan manor and its picturesque gardens. Learn how the estate has evolved over the years, was saved from Cromwell's destruction, and discover the many captivating secrets of the house including anti-witch marks on the 16th century fireplace, a message in a bottle from a Victorian squire or hidden Regency graffiti.

After a light lunch in the wonderful house, it's then off to Alton for a guided walk around the historic market town. Steeped in history, learn about its hidden gems from the Middle Ages through to the Civil War and on to today.

Four different colours are needed to achieve the desired effect for sunflower squares.
